What technology are they using?



- Desktop computers

Facebook

- Used for
 - Instant messaging
 - Writing on friends walls
 - Sharing photos/videos
 - Liking what people have shared



Twitter

- Used for
 - Tweeting statuses, this can include pictures and videos
 - Commenting on other peoples posts
 - Retweeting others posts
 - Following other people including famous people
 - Hash tagging tweets



Kik/WhatsApp

- Used for
 - Web messenger
 - Have to add people to chat to them

Instagram

- Used for
 - Sharing photos
 - Commenting on photos
 - Can opt to be private
 - Hash tagging photos
 - Direct messaging



Google+

- Similar to Facebook
- Add people to your circles (group of friends)
- Chats/Video calls/Pictures
- Tell people your mood



Skype

- Instant messaging
- Video chat
- Add people to talk to them



Tumblr

- Blogging site
- Anyone can see your blog
- You can follow any blog you want

Snap Chat

- Send pictures with caption on
- Pictures disappear after you have seen them
- Pictures can still be screenshot
- Create a slideshow of all yours posts from the day for all you contacts to see (Optional)



Meow Chat

- Enter information about yourself or use Facebook profile and then be matched with someone based on what you enter.
- Can chat both publically and privately
- Can share photos

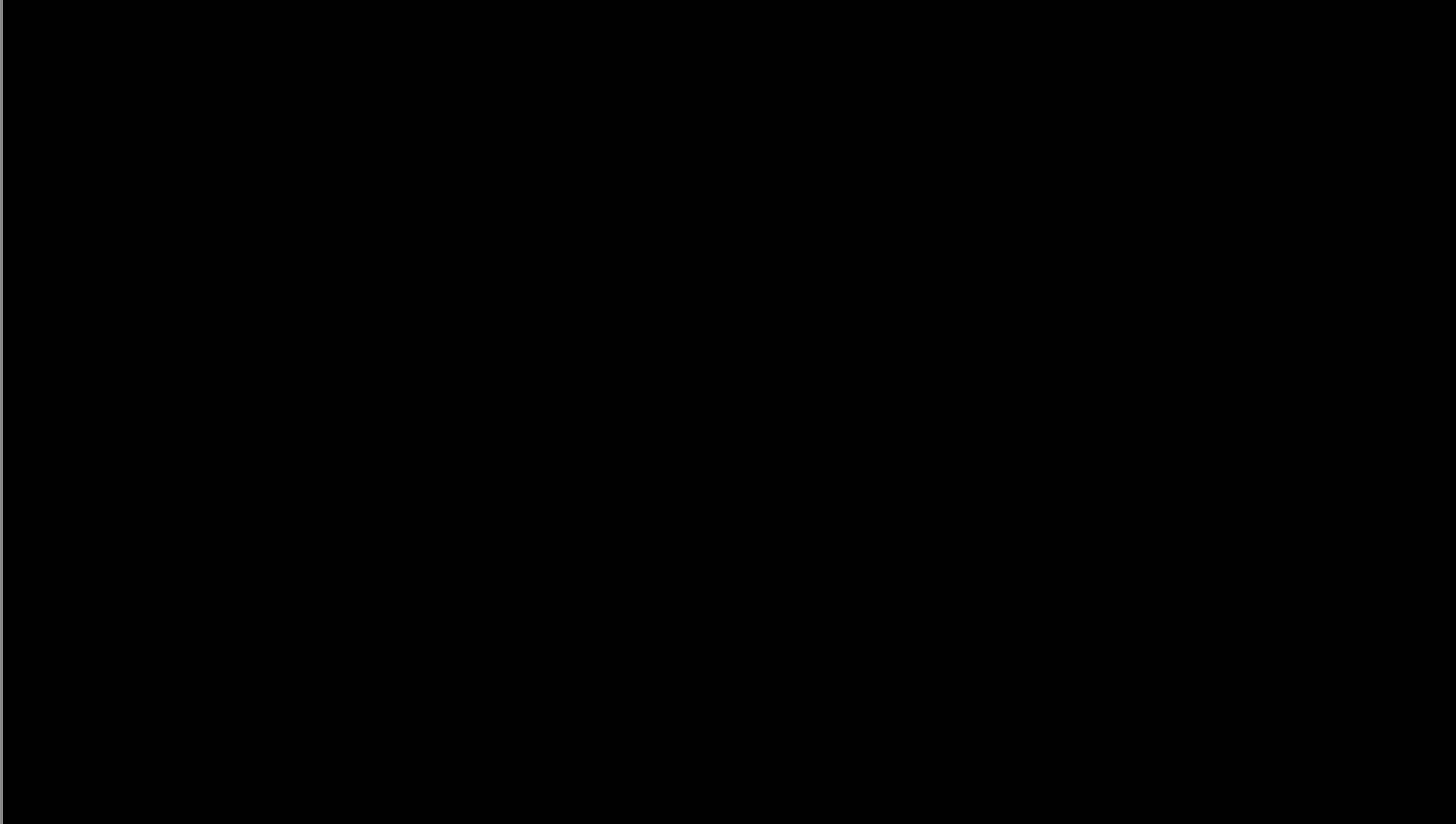

The signs of Child Sexual Exploitation

- **S**exual health and behaviour - STI's, pregnancy, terminations
- **A**bsent from school or repeatedly running away
- **F**amilial abuse and/or problems at home - living in care
- **E**motional and physical condition - self harming, low esteem, injuries
- **G**angs, older age groups and involvement in crime
- **U**se of technology and sexual bullying
- **A**lcohol and drug misuse
- **R**eceipt of unexpected gifts or money
- **D**istrust of authority figures - parents, teachers, police, social services



What you can do to help

- Be model technology users in what you do and post.
- Check privacy settings
- Take an interest and look at what they are on.
- Log into the sites with them and challenge how they know different people.
- Be there friend on social networking sites
- Talk to them about the dangers/ keep telling them
- Use strong passwords and do not share
- Inform the school of relevant information
